ПЕРЕДМОВА

Одним з найбільш ефективних засобів контролю при вивченні іноземної мови, на думку багатьох дослідників (І. В. Коломієць, С. Ю. Ніколаєва, Х. Дуглас Браун, Дж. Хант, М. Гронланд та ін.), методистів та вчителів, є тести. Їх застосування потрібне для надання напряму розумової діяльності студентів і привчання варіювати процес переробки сприйманої інформації.

Збірник тестів з англійської мови "Check your English for computing" пропонує студентам матеріали, необхідні для вивчення курсу "Інформаційні технології", які допомагають засвоїти теоретичний матеріал і підготуватись до виконання практичних та контрольних завдань з англійської мови. Він спрямований на перевірку основних знань студентів про склад комп'ютера, його типи, програмне та апаратне забезпечення, інтернет, мови програмування тощо.

Мета збірника – сформувані у студентів загальні та професійно-орієнтовані комунікативні мовленнєві компетенції (лінгвістичну, соціолінгвістичну та прагматичну) для забезпечення їхнього ефективного спілкування в академічному і професійному середовищі; сприяти розвитку здібностей до самооцінки та здатності до самостійного навчання, що дозволить студентам продовжувати навчання в академічному

і професійному середовищі як під час навчання у ВНЗ, так і після отримання диплома про вищу освіту.

Даний збірник призначений для самостійної роботи студентів спеціальності "Інформаційні технології" вищих закладів освіти як в аудиторний час, так і при індивідуальному вивченні. Зміст і формат тесту враховує головну мету навчання іноземної мови у загальноосвітніх навчальних закладах – формування в учнів іншомовної комунікативної компетентності та умінь, сформованих на основі мовних знань і навичок. Тестові завдання будуються на автентичних зразках мовлення, прийнятого у Великій Британії, та відповідають тематиці ситуативного спілкування, визначеній навчальною програмою.

Комплекс тестів складається з 626 питань та відповідей на них. Останні характеризуються репрезентативністю, оскільки включають в себе найбільш важливі елементи досліджуваного студентами лексико-граматичного матеріалу, передбаченого навчальною програмою.

Пропонований збірник тестів з англійської мови вирішує кілька важливих завдань. По-перше, він спрямований на повторення і закріплення вивченого лексико-граматичного матеріалу, поглиблення отриманих знань і націлений на формування навичок використання граматичних конструкцій та розширення лексичного запасу студентів. По-друге, дозволяє контролювати та оцінювати засвоєння студентами певного лексико-граматичного матеріалу і сформованість їх мовних навичок. Завдяки відповідям, вміщеними у кінці посібника, студенти зможуть самостійно перевірити свої знання.
